39.01 Definition of Average Daily Participation. Total meals served under the United States Department of Agriculture's National School Lunch, Breakfast, and/or After School Snack Programs (lunch $=1.0$; breakfast $=0.75$; snack $=$ 0.25 ) during three consecutive months divided by the total number of days meals were served during such months
39.02 Cooks Staffing Levels. Based upon average daily participation for the months of August through October schools configured in Kindergarten through $5^{\text {th }}$ grades (could include meals served to Pre-K aged students on Board property), $6^{\text {th }}$ through $8^{\text {th }}$ grades, and $9^{\text {th }}$ through $12^{\text {th }}$ grades, will be staffed according to the following table.

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However, each school will be staffed with a minimum of 2.0 cooks regardless of the number of meals. School locations which do not fit in the traditional configurations as indicated above shall be staffed as needed. Examples of such school locations would be William J. Raglin Center and Chandler Academy. Meals provided to related programs such as Head Start, Senior Citizen Feeding Program, and other student and community support programs will NOT have a dedicated staff for cooking.

Schools with a projected enrollment increase of more than 30 students for the subsequent year, may receive consideration for an additional half-day cook beyond what was earned during the average daily participation months (August through October), depending upon budget considerations and Superintendent approval.
39.03 Cafeteria Manager. A cafeteria manager may be employed in lieu of a cook for the next ensuing school year in schools with an average daily participation for the months of August through October of 604 or greater. Cafeteria Manager positions shall be reduced through attrition when the average daily participation is less than 604 (minimum need for 5.5 cooks). The vacated position will then be filled with a regular Cook I/II, as most schools have a Cook III position.
39.04 Adjustments to Staffing During School Year. If average daily participation for two consecutive months meets requirements for increased staff, such additional positions may be posted at the discretion of the Superintendent. However, no such additional positions will be posted following the deadline for including positions on the second month report.
