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Teachers in Kanawha County Schools will base their judgment concerning student performance on mastery of the West Virginia College and Career Standards.

The teachers should not assign marks based on percentage of achievement of some arbitrary goals which they themselves set.

All students will not perform at the same level on each standard; however, the degree to which all standards are mastered satisfactorily, will provide a means of evaluation for individual students.

Beginning with the 2018-2019 school year, achievement marks for permanent records and for the purpose of reporting to parents are assigned as follows:

Exceptional Students - Students enrolled in special classes, and who are receiving services from the Department of Exceptional Children, will be

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evaluated based on their individual prescribed program. Included students will be graded in accordance with their IEP.

Procedures for Evaluation of Student Performance

The evaluation process shall include the use of both formative and summative assessments such as informal tests, standardized and/or teacher made tests, observation, written and oral presentation, rubrics, individual and group project, etc.

On the secondary report card, each student is graded on the subjects in which he or she is actively enrolled.
