Terry Hollandsworth-We continue to monitor energy management with our performance contract with Johnson Controls. We have had a decrease of 4% in electricity since 2004 and a 21% decrease in gas. We have had a total savings of \$3,310,000 in Phase IV. We recycled 20.92 tons of cardboard this year. We put a new GPS system in all of our vans. Starting August 1st we are rolling out a new work order system. This system feeds into the digital CEFP program that the State of West Virginia and the SBA have purchased. We will able to compare KCS Maintenance to other schools systems in the country. It will take a year for us to populate the data. I gave you some information about mold prevention at Capital High School. We have a programmed schedule where fans run for 12 hours a day and the target temperature is 72 degrees. We found some thermostats that needed to be replaced. We found three units with bad fuse blocks in the electric reheat units and we are replacing them. We have added many new dehumidifiers. We have closed the outside air dampers to ensure that we do not bring in humidity. We replaced over 90 mixed air sensors. We are in the process of using a product that fogs the air handler coils called Spray Guard.

Mr. White-Have we been making sure that the other schools are mold free as well? Terry Hollandsworth-We are checking the other schools. St. Albans High School has 5 classrooms that is elevated a little. We are taking dehumidifiers out there now. East Bank had a computer lab that we put a dehumidifier in. Riverside High School has a music suite that we are putting a dehumidifier in. We are monitoring weekly those schools. Mr. White-Those were the schools that had issues last year. Are we being proactive on schools that didn't have issues? Terry Hollandsworth-The worst areas have always been the auditoriums. We are checking Nitro, GW, St. Albans and East Bank. We are not personally going out and checking all of the schools.

Mrs. White-You said we are daily checking numbers so are the numbers this year better than last years? Terry Hollandsworth-Yes, much better.

It broadens to include infectious disease, communicable disease, health education and health promotion.
