Approval of Bills for April, 2021 (Enclosure 149)

OTHER NEW BUSINESS

A. Ultraviolet Irradiation Trolley (Enclosure 151)

Mrs. Tracy White moved: The Board approve a contract for the purchase of ultraviolet irradiation trolleys in the amount of \$135,335.00 to Liberty Distributors as per Bid #21-132 as shown in Enclosure 151. Motion was seconded by Mr. Jim J. Crawford and unanimously carried.

Dr. Williams-There will be 73 of them. Each school and site will have one. For lack of a better term, they will sterilize the room to make the setting safer for our students.

Mrs. Jordon-This doesn't even come close to the other bid, I don't understand that. Alan Cummings-When we write bids we have a specific set of criteria that we use to evaluate any kind of product that's brought in. In this case, the low bid neglected to provide any kind of information to substantiate what they were bidding so we could not actually tell if it was the equivalent to what we specified or not. We gave them multiple opportunities and they did not respond so we deemed them unresponsive. The next lowest bidder was \$135,335.00. That is the product that we specified. We do a lot of business with them now and we haven't had any problems with them. Mr. White-Why are the other ones so much more expensive? Alan Cummings-They are more of a hospital grade and not necessary for our applications, however, these are commercial grade and will clean at 99.9%.

OTHER NEW BUSINESS (continued)

Mr. Cavender-Is this a new process or something we have done before? Alan Cummings-This is a new cleaning process.

Mr. Crawford-They used these at the State Wrestling Tournament and cleaned the mats immediately before they started wrestling and it was very effective. It's a wise move.

Mr. Cavender-What's the life expectancy of a unit? Ryan Bremar-The bulbs last approximately one year and when we have to replace them they are about \$20 each. It kills staph, MRSA, flu and COVID in 15 minutes. We will be able to use these in locker rooms as well as classrooms. Mrs. Jordon-How is this going to work? Ryan Bremar-We are going to have it live with the nurses. They will control it. They will be trained how to use it. If there is an outbreak in a room we can put it in there and run it. We can use it in the COVID room every day where we quarantine kids. Originally we are going to train the nurses and then they will be able to train the custodians. A school could chose to do certain wings of the school every week. Mr. White-So we are utilizing the ESSERF Funds for this? Dr. Williams-Yes, the second one. Mr. White-When will we get the 3rd one? Dr. Williams-There is a meeting on Monday with all the Treasurers and the State Department to discuss the application and hopefully they will release the application next week and we can fill it out and submit it.

Mr. Cavender-Where did we get the recommendation for this? Ryan Bremar-I was looking into things that we could do to help protect us.

B. Maintenance Department Executive Director

Dr. Williams-As you all are aware, we have advertised this position twice now and Mr. Hollandsworth, as you can see has agreed to delay his retirement until we can find a replacement, which we hope to be doing soon.

Mrs. White-I move that we go into Executive Session after the conclusion of the new business to discuss the retirement of Mr. Hollandsworth and the potential employment of someone else to fill this position. Motion was seconded by Mr. Jim J. Crawford and unanimously carried.

C. Lease, Sale and Purchase of Kanawha County Board of Education Property

Dr. Williams We have a potential lease, sale and purchase of Kanawha County Board of Education property that the Board has, however since it's in negotiations I think we need to discuss that privately.
