Parents and Guardians,

You are powerful partners in education and learning does not have to end in the classroom. How can you help at home? Here are some engaging activities that will support learning at home and help your child become more successful in their studies.

READING

Increase vocabulary and reading fluency

- Be a good role model. Let your child see you read and read often to your child.
- Ask your child to bring home a library book and read it to a younger sibling or neighbor.

Increase writing skills

- Write notes to your child and encourage them to answer with written responses.

MATH

(4th Grade Review)

Understand decimal notation for fractions, and compare decimal fractions.

- Have your child make 5 different equivalent fractions with denominators of 10 and 100. (Example: $\frac{3}{10}$ would be $\frac{30}{100}$, $\frac{5}{10}$ would be $\frac{50}{100}$)
- Use decimal notation for 10's. Have your child tell you what $\frac{6}{10}$ is as a decimal (.6). Then give them three more problems to tell you the decimal equivalency.
- Use decimal notation for 100's. Have your child tell you what $\frac{19}{100}$ is as a decimal (.19). Then give them three more problems to tell you the decimal equivalency.
- Have your child give you a fraction with a denominator of 10 or 100 and you tell them the decimal equivalency. Intentionally get one incorrect and see if your child corrects you. If not, stop them and have a conversation.
