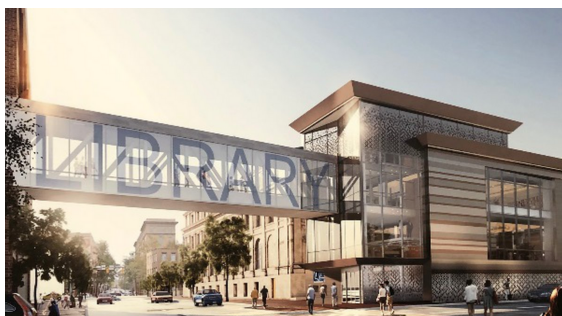


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MATH

Apply and extend previous understandings of operations with fractions to add, subtract, multiply and divide rational numbers.

- Have your child explain to you what a fraction actually means and have them give you an example.
- Have your child add the following fractions: $\frac{2}{3} + \frac{4}{5}$ Ask them what the first step is in solving this problem (finding a common denominator)
- In the fraction above, the answer was an improper fraction. Have your child explain what that is and how they would turn that in to a mixed number.
