POWERFUL PARTNERS


Parents and Guardians,

You are powerful partners in education and learning does not have to end in the classroom. How can you help at home? Here are some engaging activities that will support learning at home and help your child become more successful in their studies.

READING

Comparing and Contrasting

- Play a game of "Would You Rather?"
 Fun Examples:
 Would you rather carry a flip
 phone or use a desktop computer?
 Would you rather read e-books or
 physical books?
 Would you rather win American
 Idol or American Ninja Warrior?
- Ask your child why they chose their answers.
- On a trip around town or even in your own home, ask your child how things are similar or different. At the store, ask how fruits and vegetables are different and/or similar. While you're driving, ask your child to compare and contrast different vehicles. At home, ask them to tell you how different rooms are similar or different.



MATH

Analyze proportional relationships and use them to solve real-world and mathematical problems.

- Ask your child to talk to you about unit rates. What are they? How do you calculate them? If you have a 6 pack of paper towels and it was \$3.99, how much would one be? (.665 each)
- Have your child pick 2 things at the grocery store and determine the unit rate for each of them to determine the better deal.
- Ask your child why it would be important to determine the unit rate of items when shopping?
