Student Assistance Team (SAT)

What is it?

The SAT is a school based process designed to address the needs of all students that have academic performance, behavior, attendance, or social issues which is/are affecting the student's progress within the general education curriculum. Referral to the SAT is designed to support all students within the general education curriculum.

Who does it?

Each public school must establish a student assistance team (SAT) that consists of at least three persons, including a school administrator or designee, who shall serve as the chairperson, a current teacher(S) and other appropriate professional staff.

Who can refer a student to the SAT?

A referral can be made by the student's parent, student (when appropriate), a school staff member(s) and/or an outside agency (ex.; Prestera, Juvenile Justice system, student's personal medical doctor, etc.)
